A LETTER FROM THE EDITOR

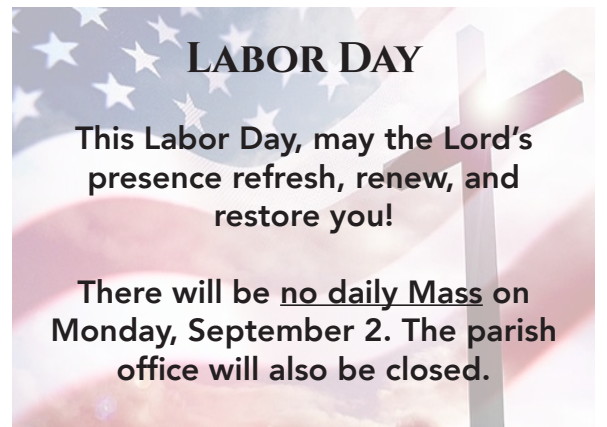

A MESSAGE FROM FINANCE COUNCIL

Dear St. Pius X Parishioners:

I'm happy to provide for your review a consolidated statement of activities for the period beginning July 1, 2023, and ending June 30, 2024 (pages 4-5 of this issue).

For the period, offertory income was \$2,006,331, which was slightly below the budget of \$2,010,100. Total operating revenue of \$2,324,676 exceeded our budget of \$2,285,165. After deducting operating expenses of \$2,040,431, we achieved a net positive operating activity of \$284,245.

Through the generosity of our parishioners, we were able to accomplish a great deal over the past fiscal year. In addition to our vibrant ministries, we were able embrace the following projects:

- Completion of the Learning Pavilion at St. Pius X School
- Installation of the Peaceable Kingdom at St. Pius X School
- Completion of a large school landscaping project on the hillside adjacent to the basketball courts
- Donations totaling 18,443 pounds of food to Greensboro Urban Ministry
- Upgraded campus lighting to increase security
- Donations totaling \$74,000 to families / organizations vetted by our We Care Team

We look forward to the 2024-2025 fiscal year projects that will continue to provide an opportunity to know, love, and serve our Lord – and each other. The financial health of St. Pius X is strong. As good stewards, we continue to manage expenses closely as we carefully consider the initiatives we pursue. I also want to thank our Finance Council and Parish Council for their leadership and support of our mission.

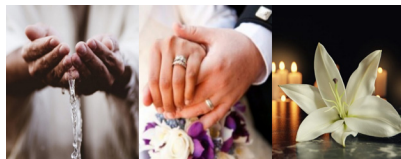


THANK YOU TO OUR PARISHIONERS, FRIENDS, AND COMMUNITY MEMBERS.

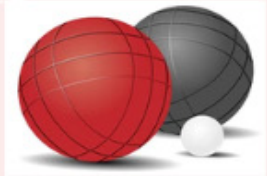

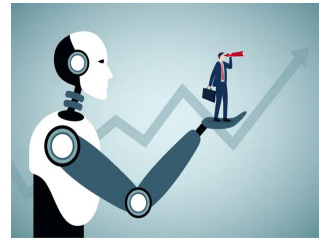
