

Harvest of Hope – Discerning Your Gifts, Devoting Your Time

Am I using the talents God gave me to serve others, build up the Church, and reflect Christ in the world? Catholic stewardship is more than a concept—it's a way of life rooted in gratitude, responsibility, and generosity. At its heart, stewardship is a response to God's love: recognizing that all we have is a gift from Him, and that we are called to use these gifts—our time, talent, and treasure—for His glory and the service of others. One of the best ways to live out stewardship is by joining a parish ministry. Whether it's helping with liturgy, music, outreach, faith formation, hospitality, or social justice, every ministry is a channel of grace—both for those who serve and for those who are served.

Why join a ministry?

- To grow spiritually: Serving in a ministry draws us closer to God and deepens our understanding of the faith.
- To build community: Ministries are places of fellowship. You meet others who share your faith and walk with you in your spiritual journey.
- To use your gifts: God gives each person unique talents. Ministries are opportunities to use those gifts in meaningful ways.
- To serve the Church: The Church is the Body of Christ. Each part is vital—and your role matters.

People often think that they don't have time, or their talent is not enough to share. Ministry is not about perfection; it's about willingness. Even small offerings of time or talent can bear great fruit when offered with love. When you join a ministry, you're not just a volunteer. You are becoming the hands and feet of Christ in the world by answering your baptismal call to discipleship.

Wondering where to start? Plan to be a part of our annual parish celebration of stewardship on the weekend of **October 25 and 26** as we gather to celebrate the abundance of gifts God has given us. There will be representatives from many of our parish ministries who can answer questions and help guide you as you discern where you can joyfully serve God, our parish and others in the community. Think about joining a ministry with a friend or make it a family affair by finding ministries to participate in together.

By embracing stewardship and becoming active in ministry, you will not only build up the Church – you become the Church. And in doing so, you become more fully who God made you to be.




