I wish you the gifts Faith, Hope, and Love that come with the Nativity of Christ, and the Joy, Peace,

and Satisfaction that come with the stewardship of sharing them others.


WHAT DOES GOD LOOK LIKE IN THE MIND OF A CHILD?

BAMBINELLI BLESSING WEEKEND

Saturday, December 11 Sunday, December 12 All Masses

Bring your Baby Jesus figurine or statue for a very special blessing during Mass. Simply place your Baby Jesus on the altar upon your arrival.

A beloved annual tradition in preparation for Christmas, the Blessing of the Bambinelli was first instituted by St. John Paul II. On the Third Sunday of Advent, the children of Rome are encouraged to bring the baby Jesus (Bambinelli) from each

of their Nativity sets to St. Peter's Square.

Following the Sunday Angelus address, the Pope blesses the figurines. Now celebrated in other churches around the world, this Advent tradition is a way for families to connect their Nativity scene at home to the celebration of Christmas at St. Pius X.



TAX-WISE WAYS TO GIVE

If you are age 70 1/2 or older, you may make a gift individual retirement account (IRA) to the Church. It's charitable distribution (QCD).

Why is a QCD such a good giving option?

- Giving directly from your IRA rather than withdrawing increase your adjusted gross income or subject your to more taxes.
- Such gifts can count toward any annual required minimum distribution (RMD). For those turning 70 1/2 beginning in 2020, the minimum age for taking RMDs has increased to 72.
- QCD gifts can be especially advantageous for those who do not expect to itemize their deductions or for those whose deductions are limited.
- You may make QCD gifts in any amount up to \$100,000 per person, per year, or \$200,000 for a couple with separate IRAs.

Can I do this with other retirement plan assets?

- The QCD is only possible with an IRA. It is possible to roll funds from other retirement plans into IRAs in order to take advantage of a QCD.
- Some people choose to simply make charitable gifts with their retirement plan withdrawals whether IRA, 401(k), 403(b), or other similar arrangements. When doing this, you will recognize income on your tax return, but you also can deduct the amount of your gift.

If you are interested in making an IRA gift to our parish or Catholic school, ask your IRA custodian for a form to arrange for a QCD. *The benefits of a QCD are subject to adjustments for those who also make deductible IRA contributions. Check with your advisors.

Can I contribute through Stock donations? Of course you can!

Reach out to people in need through a gift of stock to the Diocese of Charlotte. A gift of stock may be made via electronic transfer or by physical certificate.
