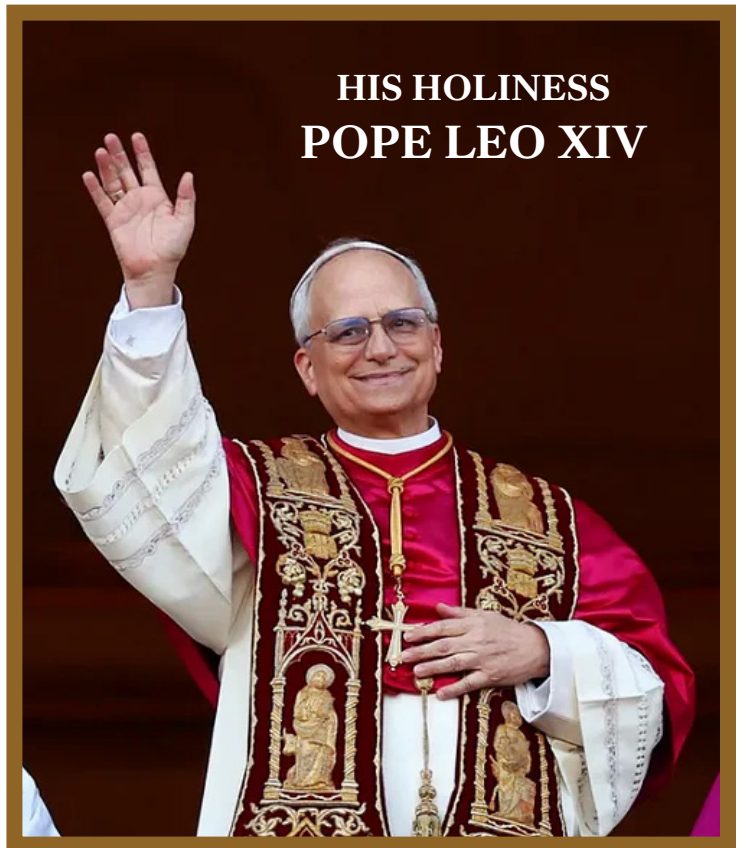

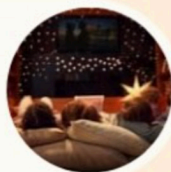

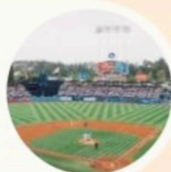

OCIA: Adults, Teens, and Children Seeking Initiation into the Catholic Church



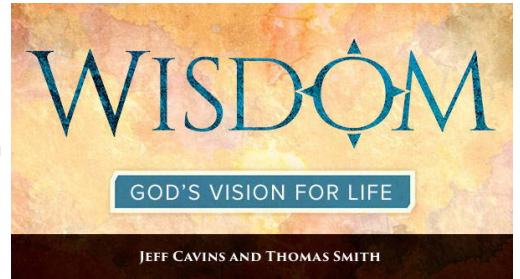
